## Easy read report summary

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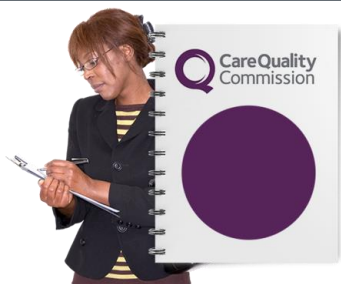
St Mary's Hospital is a hospital for people with learning disability and autism and people with acquired brain injury, where patients receive assessment and treatment.

On this inspection, we checked whether staff at St Mary's Hospital had made improvements.



We only looked at whether staff were checking patients when they had blood tests and whether staff were keeping patients safe from abuse.

# About the Care Quality Commission



## The Care Quality Commission (CQC)

checks if every health and social service gives good care to people.

We give them a score of:

- Outstanding (meaning very good)

- Requires improvement (meaning it needs to get better)
- Inadequate (meaning very poor)

## What we think about this service



We checked this service on 1 August 2019.



We did not change our ratings of St Mary's Hospital. We think this service is still **requires improvement** (meaning it needs to get better).

# 1. Is the service safe?



For the question, 'Is the service safe?', we did not change the rating.

From the last inspection, we think the service is **inadequate** (meaning very poor).

**BUT**

Staff were now checking patients who needed blood tests because of their medicine.



Staff kept better records to make sure patients were safe from abuse.



## What happens next?



We saw that staff had improved the things we looked at on this inspection.

We have asked this service to make some minor changes.

We will go back to check this service again in the future.
